

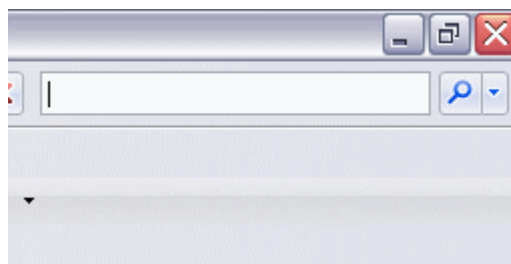
HOW TO ADD 'EASYSEARCH' TO INTERNET EXPLORER

If you are currently using the Internet Explorer browser on your computer, here is an alternative way to use the 'EasySearch' search engine, thus helping to earn valuable income for Cray Wanderers FC.

Whilst 'EasySearch' is free to use for surfers, it can still be a bit of a bind to use the service by clicking on a link on the Forever Amber website, and then having to wait for the search engine to load as a new page in your browser. So, here is a viable alternative, whereby the search box can be immediately available directly from Internet Explorer.

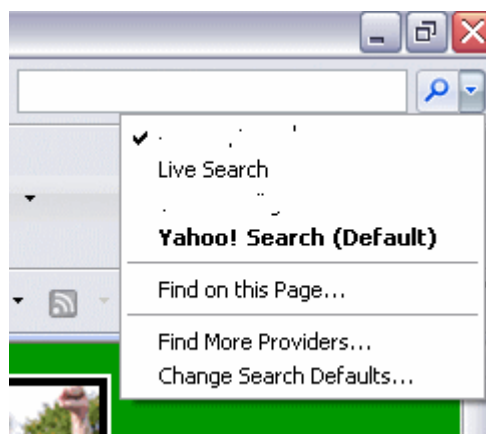
Step One

I'll assume that you've got Internet Explorer open already, as you are reading this. In the top right-hand corner there is a search box, next to which is something that looks a bit like a mini tennis racquet, and beside that is a drop down arrow (see graphic below).



Step Two

Click once on the drop down arrow. You will then see a list of your existing search engines that are available to you on Internet Explorer, thus:



Step Three

Click once on 'Find More Providers'. This will transport your Internet Explorer to the following page:

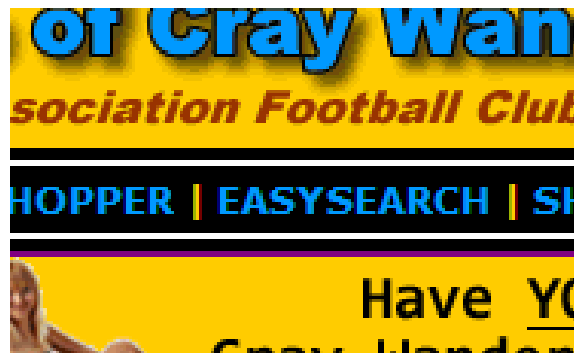
1. Visit the desired search engine in another window or tab

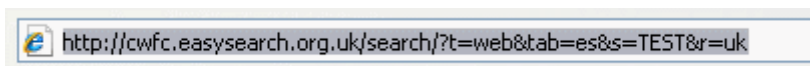
The part of the website that we are interested in is the box with the yellow background and two text boxes.

Step Four

If you don't already have the Forever Amber website open, please open it in another browser window and locate the 'EasySearch' link (see screenshot below)



Hover your mouse pointer over the word 'EasySearch' and click on it. This will bring you to the 'EasySearch' page. In the search box, type **TEST** in capital letters and click on the 'easysearch' button. When the results page loads, go to the browser line, highlight the full address and then copy it to your clipboard.



Now return to the screen with the yellow box on it (shown again below)

Create Your Own

Add your own search provider to your copy of Internet Explorer by following these steps:

In the first text box under part 3 (circled), place the mouse cursor inside and right-click once. Choose 'Paste' from the drop down menu. This should place the address coding within the box. We can now move on to the next stage.

Stage Five

In the second text box under part 4, give the search box a name. For my own IE browser I chose 'CWEasySearch' (without the speechmarks). Just why this needs to be done will become evident shortly.

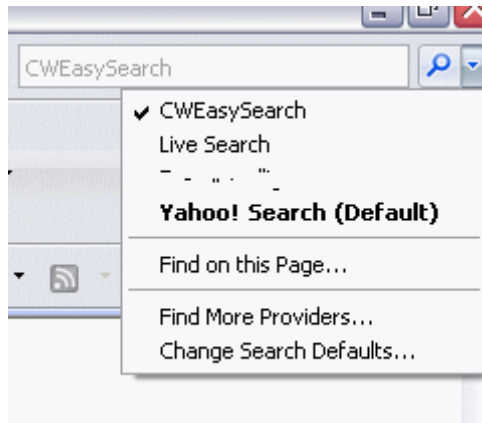

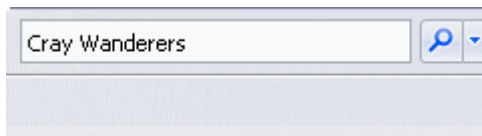
If your search provider doesn't install correctly, [click here](#) to select another character encoding.

Once these two boxes are completed, click on the 'Install' button. This will bring up a confirmation page. Click Yes or OK to accept.

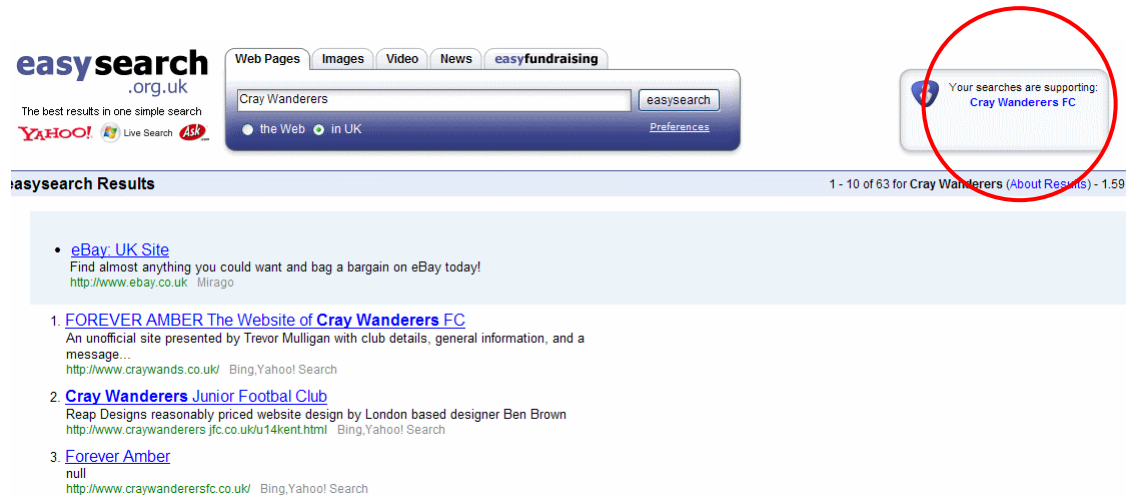
The installation will only take a matter of seconds. Once completed, this will allow you to make your 'EasySearch' searches via the box in the top corner of Internet Explorer, as shown below:



Make sure that 'CWEasySearch' (or whatever you decide to call yours) is ticked on the drop down menu (please see image above), then simply type in your search subject and click enter, for instance as shown here:



This will bring you to the search results page of 'EasySearch', and each of your searches performed in this way will still go to support Cray Wanderers FC (as indicated by the circle in the image below).



And that's it! Please help to support Cray Wanderers by making all your searches via 'EasySearch'.
